Chapel Dress Code

Boys: Navy blue or khaki slacks with a belt (no shorts), white or light blue oxford shirt, navy blue blazer, a necktie of your choice, and loafer or tie-style dress shoes (no sneakers).

Girls: Navy blue sweater or blazer, skirt, kilt or jumper (no slacks, pants, skorts or shorts), white or light blue oxford shirt or long-sleeve or short-sleeve polo shirt, or long or short sleeve polo dress, and dress shoes (no sneakers).

PARENT PARKING: All of the parking spaces in the school parking lot and at the blue house are reserved for faculty and staff during school hours. Parents and other visitors may only park in the marked "visitor" spaces in front of the Craig School, or, if appropriate, in the handicapped space next to the ramp. If these spots are filled, on leaving the parking lot, turn right on Tower Hill Road. Go to the intersection. You may either (1) turn left at the intersection and park on Laurel Hill Road, or (2) go straight through the intersection and park on Tower Hill Road. If you park on the street, do not park opposite a car on the other side of the street. Please do not block our neighbors' driveways.
